Lovington EDC Welcomes Big Dog Industries!



On February 13th the Lovington Economic Development Corporation made the announcement that they had signed an agreement to transfer ownership of the 90,000 square foot building formerly known as the Lovington Cheese Plant to Big Dog Industries. To assist the project, the New Mexico Economic Development Department has pledged a total of \$750,000 dollars from the State Economic Development Fund. In addition, the City of Lovington has pledged an additional \$250,000 worth of incentives from the Local Economic Development Fund.

Big Dog Industries CEO, Brian Meyer, is a fourth-generation Nebraska farmer who has extensive experience with hemp, corn, wheat, and soybean production. This company will invest over \$15 million into the facility and seed-to-retail business over the next several years and will directly employ 125 people at the Lovington facility. Products that will be manufactured will include oils, lotions, edibles, clothing, chocolates, and bath products.
